



Heat-related Injuries

Many people find themselves exposed to heat while on the job. Work involving high air temperatures, radiant heat sources, elevated humidity, direct contact with hot objects or strenuous physical activities leave workers at risk of heat-related illness. Outdoor operations such as construction work, oil and gas well operations, asbestos removal, landscaping and hazardous waste site activities also increase such risk.

When a person works in a hot environment, the body must rid itself of excess heat to maintain a stable internal temperature. It does this mainly by circulating blood to the skin, and through sweating.

If the body cannot rid itself of excess heat, it stores it. When this happens, the individual's core temperature rises and the heart rate increases. As the body continues to store heat, the individual begins to lose concentration, finds it difficult to focus on tasks, may become irritable or sick and often loses the desire to drink. If the heat stress continues, the person often faces fainting spells, or even death.
